While Sledge enlisted in the Marine Corps more than 70 years ago, the responsibility he felt toward his country still exists today. That sense of duty inspires 180,000 young men and women to join the armed forces each year.

However, that responsibility doesn't just fall on their shoulders. We, as a country, also have a responsibility to those who have served to protect our privileges.
